1-Square Foot = \$60 Insulation = \$1,400

House Wrap = \$300 Exterior Doors & Windows = \$1,600

Driveway & Sidewalk = \$1,500 Foundation = \$2,700

Habitat offers families a hand-up, not a hand-out. Prospective homeowners must invest 300 hours of "sweat equity", make a \$600 down payment, attend classes on budgeting, finances, home care and other topics to improve their financial literacy. Habitat homes are sold to partner families at no profit and financed with affordable, zero-interest Habitat mortgages. Habitat homes are affordable because they are simple and are



built mostly by volunteers. The homeowner's mortgage payments go into a Fund for Humanity to build more houses in our community. Thank you!


